SIX SEC ATHLETES EARN ALL-AMERICA HONORS

The Arkansas women finished fifth nationally and the Southeastern Conference had six individuals earn All-America honors by placing in the top-40 at the NCAA Cross Country Championships at the Wabash Valley Family Sports Center.

The Arkansas women totaled 209 points to finish fifth overall, while the Vanderbilt women were 28th with 598 total team points. The Arkansas men placed 28th with 647 team points and the Ole Miss men - making their first-ever NCAA Championships appearance - were 29th with 685 points.

The fifth-place finish by Arkansas was the highest for an SEC women's cross country team at the NCAA Championships since the Razorbacks placed fifth in 2006.

The SEC had five women finish in the top-40 to earn All-America status. It was the most women's All-Americans for the SEC in a single year since six women from SEC institutions earned All-America honors in 1994.

Arkansas' Dominique Scott earned a sixth-place finish with a time of 20:01.3 to mark the highest finish for an SEC woman since Kentucky's Cally Macumber also placed sixth in 2012. Tennessee's Chelsea Blaase, competing in her first NCAA Championship meet, placed 10th in a time of 20:11.6 to become the Volunteers' first cross country All-American since Sarah Bowman in 2008.

Mississippi State's Rhianwedd Price, in her first nationals appearance, was 24th in a time of 20:30.0 to become her school's first All-America honoree since April Ecke in 1993. Texas A&M had a pair of women's All-Americans with Grace Fletcher finishing 29th (20:36.9) and Hillary Montgomery placing 39th (20:43.7). It marks the first time since 2000 since the Aggies placed two runners in the top-40 at the NCAA Championships.

Arkansas' Stanley Kebenei was the SEC's lone All-American on the men's side. He placed sixth overall in a 10K time of 30:30.1. It is his second consecutive sixth-place finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championships.

ARKANSAS MEN, WOMEN WIN 2014 SEC TITLES

The University of Arkansas men's and women's cross country teams captured the 2014 Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championships at the Harry Pritchett Running Course in Tuscaloosa, Ala.

The No. 5 Arkansas women won their league-leading 15th all-time SEC Cross Country Championship and second consecutive, scoring 32 total team points. No. 14 Vanderbilt was second with 85 points, while host Alabama was third with 140 points. It was the best team finish for the Crimson Tide women at the meet since 1994.

"I'm just elated," Arkansas women's head coach Lance Harter said. "Every journey is different; there are always ups and downs for one reason or another with every individual. For us to put everything together, I think this is as rewarding as any championship."

Arkansas' Dominique Scott became just the sixth woman in SEC history to win multiple individual SEC cross country titles, capturing her second in a row in a time of 19:22.74. It is the second-fastest winning time in meet history and it helped spark four Razorbacks in the top-10 of the individual standings. Scott's teammate Grace Heymsfield was second in a time of 19:32.21, while Tennessee's Chelsea Blaase was third in 19:32.37.

The No. 23 Arkansas men took home their fifth consecutive SEC team title and their 22nd in the last 24 years, totaling 54 team points and placing four runners in the top-10. Ole Miss was a close second, placing three runners in the top-10, and totaling 60 team points. Auburn was third with 77 points, sparked by Ty McCormack's second-place finish.

"I'm really proud of this group," Arkansas head coach Chris Bucknam said. "We lost two low sticks last year in Solomon Haile and Kemoy Campbell to graduation. This group wasn't deterred by that, and they've been working hard all year. This was the result. I'm proud of our team; this was a big win for us."

Arkansas' Stanley Kebenei captured the SEC men's individual cross country title, giving the Razorbacks their third men's individual title in the last four years, clocking a time of 23:49.27. Auburn's Ty McCormack was second in 23:58.64, while Ole Miss' Wes Gallagher was third in 24:21.28.

SEC IN THE NCAA: CROSS COUNTRY HISTORY

- The SEC has won eight NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, with Arkansas claiming seven and Tennessee winning one. The last SEC NCAA Championship came in 2000, with Arkansas winning its third consecutive.
- The SEC has won one NCAA Women's Cross Country Championship, with Kentucky holding the only title, which the Wildcats won in 1988.
- The SEC boasts two NCAA Cross Country individual titles, as Godfrey Siamusiye of Arkansas won back-to-back national crowns in 1995 and 1996.
- No SEC woman has ever claimed an NCAA Cross Country individual championship. Four SEC women have finished as the NCAA runner-up: Shelly Steely, Florida (1984); Valerie McGovern, Kentucky (1989); Deena Drossin, Arkansas (1992) and Amy Yoder, Arkansas (1999).

ABOUT THE SEC

- Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has directed and organized inter-scholastic athletic competitions, conducted tournaments and prescribed eligibility rules for student-athletes. The Conference also facilitates and assists its member institutions in maintaining intercollegiate athletic programs compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.
- The Southeastern Conference crowns champions in 21 sports - 12 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, equestrian, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- In the fall of 2012, the University of Missouri and Texas A&M University became the 13th and 14th members of the Southeastern Conference. It marked the first expansion for the SEC since 1991 and the second-ever increase for the league since its founding in 1933.

• The Southeastern Conference had 46 Capital One Academic All-Americans in 2013-14. The league had 17 student-athletes earn first-team honors. The Capital One Academic All-America Teams are voted on by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). The 46 student-athletes represent 11 of the SEC 14 schools while seven schools had at least one person on the first-team. Since 2003, the SEC has had 232 student-athletes earn first-team Capital One Academic All-America status.

• The Southeastern Conference won seven national championships in 2013-14: Baseball (Vanderbilt); Equestrian (Georgia); Men's Golf (Alabama); Gymnastics (Florida); Softball (Florida); Women's Swimming & Diving (Georgia); and Women's Outdoor Track & Field (Texas A&M).
The SEC also had a national runner-up in six sports, including: Men's Basketball (Kentucky); Equestrian (South Carolina); Football (Auburn); Softball (Alabama); Men's Indoor Track & Field (Arkansas); and Men's Outdoor Track & Field (Florida).

TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOK

ALABAMA

Three Alabama athletes - Robbie Farnham-Rose, Hannah Waggoner and Katelyn Greenleaf - earned All-Region Honors by the United States Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) for their performances at the NCAA South Region Championships held Friday, November 14, in Tallahassee, Florida ... the Alabama women's team finished third among a field of 29 teams at the South Regional Championships while the Crimson Tide men's squad finished 15th in a field of 22 teams ... the Alabama women finished with 135 points, just behind Vanderbilt (52 points) and Florida State (53 points) ... Alabama's third-place finish in the women's standings was highlighted by an 11th place showing by Waggoner, a sophomore, who finished in a time of 20.01, beating her previous personal best time of 20:43 set earlier this season at the Paul Short Invitational ... junior Katelyn Greenleaf crossed the line 12th overall in a time of 20.04, a 34-second improvement from her previous personal best time set at the 2013 South Region meet ... the Tide men were led by sophomore Robbie Farnham-Rose, who finished the 10-kilometer race in 18th overall in a time of 30:58 ... senior Matt Airola was the next Tide athlete to cross the line in a time of 31:49.1 to finish 56th overall ... both Tide squads look to return the bulk of their rosters in 2015 as the women's team did not have a senior on the 2014 roster while the men's team stands to lose only one runner (Airola) from its 2014 roster.

ARKANSAS

Men - Senior Stanley Kebenei earned his second career sixth-place finish at the NCAA Cross Country Championships, as he crossed the finish line in 30:30.10 to lead the Arkansas men's cross country team to a 28th-place team finish. Kebenei becomes the 30th runner in school history to earn multiple NCAA All-American honors and is the second runner in the Chris Bucknam era to accomplish the feat, as Dorian Ulrey collected back-to-back All-American accolades during the 2009 and 2010 seasons. Kebenei's performance spearheaded a group of Razorback harriers that posted a score of 647 to place 28th overall. Junior Cale Wallace was the second Arkansas runner to cross the finish line, as he came in 151st (31:57.40). Freshman Alex George collected a 10-kilometer time of 32:20.50 to place 183 and junior Gabe Gonzalez posted a mark of 32:45.30 to earn a 209th-place finish. Redshirt sophomore Aidan Swain rounded out the scoring rotation with a time of 32:55.00 to place 218. **Women** - Redshirt junior Dominique Scott concluded her remarkable 2014 season by picking up her second career NCAA All-American nod. Scott's performance led the way for a fifth-place finish for the Arkansas women's cross country team at the NCAA Cross Country Championships. Scott, the two-time Southeastern Conference Runner of the Year, posted a sixth-place finish at the 2014 NCAA Cross Country Championship to collect her second-straight NCAA All-American honor. The Cape Town, South Africa, native posted a 6-kilometer time of 20:01.30 to become just the ninth Arkansas harrier to earn multiple NCAA All-American admirations, and the first in 14 years, as Lilli Kleinmann was the last Razorback to garner multiple All-American honors, earning the award during the 1999 and 2000 seasons. The Razorbacks had each of their five scoring runners place inside the top 100 to collect a score of 209 points. Redshirt junior Diane Robison was the second Arkansas runner to cross the finish line, coming in 55th with a 6-kilometer time of 20:55.40. Senior Jessica Kamilos placed 58th (20:56.30), redshirt senior Grace Heymfield placed 72nd (21:02.50) and senior Shannon Klenke earned a 94th-place finish with a time of 21:10.90 to round out the team's scoring rotation.

AUBURN

Auburn senior Kane Grimster finished 169th with a time of 32:07.0 while senior Ty McCormack clocked a 32:38.6 to finish 204th at the NCAA Cross Country Championships at the Lavern Gibson Championship Cross Country Course in Terre Haute, Ind. Grimster earned his way to the NCAA Championships after finishing eighth at the NCAA South Regional with a time of 30:33.1. The Victoria, Australia, native earned his second-consecutive All-SEC honor, finishing ninth at the SEC Championships. McCormack concluded his cross country career with four wins in the 2014 campaign, including a win at the NCAA South Regional. McCormack was runner-up at the SEC Championships and was named

SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and USTFCCCA South Region Runner of the Year.

FLORIDA

The Florida Gators cross country teams ended their seasons at the NCAA South Regional Championships in Tallahassee. Behind personal-bests from sixth of its seven runners, the women's team finished fifth, while the Gator men earned an eighth-place mark. **Men** - Without the leadership of redshirted seniors Jimmy Clark and Eddie Garcia, a young Gator squad, featuring five underclassmen in its starting lineup, placed second or better in its first three competitions, highlighted by a season-opening win at the Western Carolina Invitational on Aug. 29. Freshman Thomas Howell emerged as a strong competitor for the Gators, earning SEC Freshman Runner of the Week after a fifth-place finish (24:45.76, 8K) at a very competitive Mountain Dew Invitational on Sept. 20. The Niceville, Fla. native also was named to the 2014 All-SEC Freshman Team after a strong showing at the SEC Championships. With none of the starters from the 2014 squad expected to graduate, and the return of Clark and Garcia, the Gators will look to build on their 10th-place and eighth-place marks at the SEC and Regional Championships, respectively, in 2015. **Women** - A youthful squad got off to a very fast start in 2014, winning its first two meets, the Western Carolina Invitational and Mountain Dew Invitational. Led by a trio of record-breaking underclassmen, sophomore Taylor Tubbs, redshirt freshman Becky Greene and freshman Laruen Brasure, the Gators finished seventh at the SEC Championships and fifth at the NCAA South Regional Championships. Tubbs was the first Gator to finish in three races this season, and earned her first-collegiate victory in the season-opening Western Carolina Invitational. In her second collegiate season, Tubbs bested her 6K PR from her freshman campaign by 38 seconds, decreasing her time from a 20:59.36 to a 20:21.00. The sophomore finished 2014 on a high note by setting her new 6K PR and earning USTFCCCA All-Region laurels. First-year runner Lauren Brasure emerged in 2014 as one of the SEC's rising stars. She was the first Gator to finish in three races this season, and added her first collegiate-victory at the Mountain Dew Invitational. Her 5K time of 16:45.93 not only set the UF course record and broke former Gator great and 2012 Olympian Genevieve LaCaze's record, but marked the seventh-fastest 5K in the history of Florida women's cross country. Additionally, Brasure picked up two conference honors, winning Women's Freshman Runner of the Week two times. Greene, a native of New Zealand, entered her first cross country season for Florida after being named the 2014 SEC Women's Freshman Runner of the Year and earning All-American laurels on the track. The redshirt freshman was a consistent and gritty competitor for Florida, earning two top-three finishes, while earning USTFCCCA All-Region honors. Florida is not expected to lose a starter from a lineup that produced six 6K personal-bests in the season finale race at the South Regional Championships.

GEORGIA

Men - The Bulldogs concluded their 2014 campaign with a ninth-place finish (260 points) at the 10K NCAA South Regional Championship in Tallahassee, Fla. Topping four other SEC squads, Georgia's performance was highlighted by junior Steven Spevacek earning All-Region honors with a 10th-place individual finish (30:41.50). This marked a 25-place improvement from his 2013 finish after he was Georgia's sixth finisher a year ago in 35th. Like four other meets this year, redshirt sophomore Morgan Malanoski was UGA's second finisher after taking 40th (31:31.60) during his first trip to the Regionals. All-SEC Freshman Bryan Kamau locked down the third spot for Georgia with a 54th-place finish thanks to a time of 31:45.30. The Bulldogs' final two scorers finished within four spots of each other. Fellow true freshman Eric Westog ran a 32:22.50 for 86th place while junior Michael Giuliano took 90th (32:26.60) in his first NCAA post-season action. The only two seniors on Georgia's 2014 team - Brendan Hoban and Zack Sims - redshirted this year and are expected to return for the 2015 campaign. In addition, junior Sid Vaughn is expected to return from a redshirt season for next year. Distance coach Patrick Cunniff wrapped up his third year back in red and black after competing for Georgia from 1988-91. **Women** - The Georgia women scored 246 points to take eighth at the NCAA South Regional Championships. After being the second Lady

Bulldog runner across the line in four meets this year, redshirt sophomore Lauren Kelly took charge in Tallahassee and was 32nd (20:37.80) in the 6K race. Five spots behind Kelly was true freshman Taylor Tuttle, who had led Georgia in five meets prior to last weekend. Tuttle finished as the sixth freshman and 37th overall after clocking a 20:42.20. Her true freshman teammate Addy Lippitt managed to finish third for Georgia after completing the course in 20:52.80 for 48th place. Keeping the youth movement trend going, redshirt sophomore Victoria Coppage took 62nd (21:03.50) to score while redshirt freshman Morgan Green was Georgia's fifth and final scorer in 71st place (21:11.40). Green had scored only one other time for the Lady Bulldogs in her career. Georgia has only six seniors on its roster and two of those - track All-American Carly Hamilton and Erika Ramsey - sat out this cross season and are expected back in 2015.

KENTUCKY

The Kentucky cross country teams concluded the season at the 2014 NCAA Southeast Regional Championships. The UK men produced a top 10 finish, ninth overall with 353 points, led by a pair of middle distance track specialists who put in respectable 10,000-meter times. Keffri Neal, the 2014 NCAA 800M Bronze Medalist, was the first Wildcat to finish, in 40th place with a time of 31:10.80. He was closely followed by senior and three-time SEC Champion in track events, Matt Hillenbrand, who placed one spot behind Neal with a time of 31:12.50. Katy Kunc led the women's team to a 12th-place finish with a 27th-place time of 20:48.3, which was her 6K season best. Aundrea Busse was UK's No. 2 finisher, 57th overall, in 21:30.3.

LSU

Junior Morgan Schuetz finished in 46th place at the 2014 NCAA South Central Regional Championships held in Fayetteville, Ark. leading the women to a 12th-place team finish, while Junior Travis Pope placed 62nd to help the men place 18th. The Lady Tigers finished with a total of 330 points racing the 6k course at Agri Park XC course, and the men tallied up a total of 471 points while racing the 10k course. The Arkansas Razorbacks finished first in the 10k and 6k race as the women totaled 29 points and the men totaled 42 points. Schuetz topped her previous time from the 2013 regional meet by over a minute, crossing the line at 21 minutes and 43.4 seconds. Senior Andria Aguilar finished shortly behind Schuetz setting a personal best with a time of 21:77.8 for 52nd place. Sophomore Chais Matthews came in 78th place clocking 22:31.6, while senior Andrea Maxwell and sophomore Jenna Walker finished seconds apart for 90th and 92nd place. Pope also set a personal best at the meet clocking 31:33.3, beating last year's time by over a minute. Senior Philip Dempsey placed 88th with a time of 32:00.5, while senior Philip Primeaux finished 13 seconds behind Dempsey for a top-100 finish.

OLE MISS

Men - The Ole Miss men's historic season season drew to a close with a 29th place finish at the NCAA Championships. The appearance was the first XC Nationals appearance in program history. Wesley Gallagher (31.23.2) led Ole Miss in the 10K event, good for 80th overall, improving from his 149th finish last season as an individual for Northeastern. SEC Freshman of the Year Sean Tobin, who clocked the best time for Ole Miss earlier in the season at the Pre-National Invitational on the same course, did not finish the race due to injury. The 2014 season saw the Rebels receive numerous honors and achieve program-firsts. Those include the first regional championship and Nationals berth in program history as well as matching the program's best SEC finish (runner-up). Head coach Brian O'Neal received the USTFCCCA South Region Coach of the Year for the landmark season in his third year at the helm. The Rebel individual honors include the SEC Freshman of the Year (Tobin), five All-Region honorees (Gallagher, Tobin, Robert Domanic, Trevor Gilley, Taylor Caldwell), three All-SEC first teamers (Gallagher, Tobin, Domanic) and three SEC All-Freshmen (Tobin, Caldwell, Mark Robertson). **Women** - The Ole Miss women's season came to a close with a 13th place finish of 29 teams at the NCAA South Regional. Margaret Harkness (20:58.30) led the young Rebel squad with a 55th overall finish. Margaret Harkness and Shelby Brown each clocked the best time for Ole Miss in two meets apiece after

Mary Alex England missed the majority of the season with injury. Injuries forced several young runners to step up this season and gain invaluable experience going forward.

MISSISSIPPI STATE

Rhianwedd Price concluded a phenomenal 2014 cross country campaign by earning All-American accolades after finishing in the top-25 at the NCAA Championships. Price ran a time of 20:30.00 to complete to finish 24th. She became MSU's second women's cross country All-American, the first being April Ecke in 1993. Price, who maintained a position in the front pack for the majority of the race, had a strong finish to stay in the top 25. Price had been the leader of the MSU women's cross country team throughout the season. She finished in the top 10 in all previous races during the season, including a first-place finish at the season opener, the Memphis Twilight.

MISSOURI

The Tiger women repeated their sixth-place Midwest Regional finish from 2013 in Peoria, Ill., on Nov. 14. Leading the way for the black and gold was SEC Freshman of the Year, Karissa Schweizer, whose seventh-place finish was enough to earn her an individual qualification into the NCAA Championships on Saturday, November 22, in Terre Haute, Ind. Sophomore Kaitlyn Fischer notched her second All-Midwest finish, crossing in 21st overall, followed by senior Courtney Wood, senior Courtney Brown, and sophomore Kayla Wolf. The men placed 17th in the field behind sophomore Drew White's 45th-place effort. Schweizer will take to the line at noon, ET, on the LaVern Gibson Championship Cross Country Course.

SOUTH CAROLINA

The Carolina women's cross country season came to a close at the Southeast Regionals, finishing 18th as a team. Junior Anna Todd was the team's top finisher for the sixth time this season after she finished 39th overall. She rallied to place in the top 40, rising 15 spots from 54th to 39th in the final half of the course. Her big jump in the final half was the second-best among top-50 runners, just behind Cleo Boyd of Virginia who went from 50th to 33rd. Injuries would cost the team late in the season, as early contributors like Mary Reiser and Hannah Giangaspro were unable to participate in the season finale. Stephanie Berger was the team's second finisher behind Todd, crossing with a time of 22:16 to take 101st. Redshirt freshman Meri Heneage set a new career best 6K time with a 22:28.5 performance to place 121st overall. Junior Christine Kent rounded out the top 125 after recording a 22:32.7 time for 125th. The future is bright for the Gamecocks, as four of the team's seven runners are either in their first or second year with the team. South Carolina has no seniors on the roster this season and will only lose Berger, who will graduate this spring.

TENNESSEE

Junior Chelsea Blaase capped an incredible junior season with All-America honors at the 2014 NCAA Cross Country Championships, finishing in 10th place to become the women's program's 10th All-American and the first under first-year director of track and field/cross country Beth Alford-Sullivan. After qualifying for the national championships for the first time in her career at last weekend's South Regional, Blaase traversed the 6,000 kilometer course in 20 minutes, 11.6 seconds to finish inside the top 10 for the seventh time in seven races this season. Her 10th place finish makes her the first women's runner from Tennessee to place inside the top 10 since Patty Wiegand was fifth back in 1989. With the top 40 runners in the race earning All-America honors, Blaase also becomes the first UT women's runner to grab All-America accolades since Sarah Bowman in 2008. On the men's side, Tennessee senior Austin Whitelaw was unable to finish the race after sustaining an injury in the early stages. Whitelaw concludes his collegiate cross country career at his first-ever NCAA Championships and became the third Vol in the last three years to qualify for the final after finishing in seventh place at the South Regional. A native of St. Joseph, Illinois, Blaase's All-American honors come on the heels of a tremendous junior season in which she placed no worse than third in any of the six meets leading up to the NCAA Championships. She opened the year with three straight runner-up finishes before capturing the second

individual title of her collegiate career when she took the gold at the Crimson Classic on Oct. 17. From there, Blaase turned in a career-best finish of third at the SEC Championships, posting a career-best 6K time of 19:32.37 in the process. That time would not hold for long as she again set a personal best at the 6K distance, finishing runner-up at the NCAA South Region Championships at 19:26.20 -- a time that made her the first female qualifier from UT since 2011.

TEXAS A&M

Men – The Aggies repeated a seventh-place finish from last season at the NCAA South Central Region meet, improving their score by 40 points from 2013 with a tally of 177 points. Ryan Miller led A&M for the second consecutive meet in placing 26th (30:27.1) with teammates Isaac Spencer (30:27.5) and Austin Wells (30:28.3) following in 27th and 28th place. The next two Aggie finishers to complete the scoring five were Christian Farris (31:10.5) and Cameron Villarreal (31:14.0). Also racing for A&M were Austin Geerts (57th-31:23.1) and Ryan Teel (60th-31:31.6). **Women** – A pair of All-America honors were earned by Texas A&M seniors Grace Fletcher and Hillary Montgomery as they placed among the top 40 amid a field of 253 finishers during the NCAA Championships held on the LaVern Gibson Championship Course. This marks the first time since 2000 that the Aggies had two runners place among the top 40 finishers in the NCAA cross country final when Melissa Gulli (22nd) and Andrea Bookout (26th) led the A&M squad to an 18th place team finish that season. In her national championship debut Fletcher turned in a splendid effort, covering the 6,000-meter course in a time of 20 minutes, 36.9 seconds to place 29th. Montgomery's second venture in the NCAA Championship was impressive as well and resulted in a time of 20:43.7 for 39th place.

VANDERBILT

Closing out a historic season, the No. 12-ranked Vanderbilt women's cross country team finished 28th at the NCAA Championships at the Wasbush Valley Family Sports Center in Terre Haute, Indiana. The race represented the fourth straight appearance in the Championships for the Commodores, who captured the NCAA South Region title for the first time in the program's history. Sophomore Carmen Carlos was the Commodores' top finisher, posting a time of 21:16.60. Two Vanderbilt seniors -- Claire Benjamin and Amira Joseph -- were the next two Commodores across the line. Benjamin finished at 21:43.30 and Joseph, who was competing at nationals for the fourth consecutive year, posted a time of 21:43.30. Junior Sara Barron (21:44.20) and senior Rebecca Chandler (21:47.10) rounded out the top-5 for the Commodores. Also representing Vanderbilt were: senior Katherine Delaney (21:50.30) and junior Vanessa Valentine (22:38.30). Vanderbilt will take away plenty of highlights from the 2014-15 season, including tying for ninth place at the adidas Invitational in Wisconsin by finishing in front of 10 teams that were ranked ahead of them in the USTFCCCA poll. Also, the Commodores captured titles at the Belmont Opener and the Commodore Classic, and finished eighth at the Roy Griak Invitational while setting the stage for the impressive postseason run. On the men's side, John Ewing took 46th place with a time of 31:39.50 as the Vanderbilt men's cross country team earned a 19th-place finish at the NCAA South Region Championship. Nick French was Vanderbilt's next runner, finishing 94th at 32:29.70. Also representing Vanderbilt were: Sam Reilly (115th at 32:59.70), Jake Van Geffen (131st at 33:49.20), Andrew Bachman (139th at 34:12.80), Matthew Cleveland (144th at 34:31.20) and Andrew Fix (156th at 35:19.10).
